

JANUARY 15, 2023

Greetings from 2023, looking back on 2022!

It seems since Covid-19 that the regular theme of accounting and even reckoning the passage of time somehow seems different. In particular, for the writing of this report, things we used to measure, now perhaps do not mean as much. And things we didn't measure before, such as our electronic video presence, have taken on an increase of significance. Thereby, the year is hard to summarize, and yet reports like that perhaps, especially now with the confusing times before us, are a worthy endeavor.

Wednesday Night Services

This past September we started Wednesday evening worship services at 6:45 p.m. These services start at the end of confirmation instruction and are intended to 'count as' the Sunday weekend service. Typically, the services have in attendance anywhere from 30-55 people. The service started at the recommendation of Zion's Vision Committee (at another annual meeting) because the committee saw a need for offering worship service during the week for parents and their children who are committed on the weekends.

Deaths and Baptisms

There is a connection between deaths and baptisms. Typically, growth for churches happens when baptisms exceed deaths. This trend is true for Zion this year. There were 23 baptisms this past year, to the glory of God. And, conversely, from Zion's membership there were 11 deaths. There were more funerals, but from Zion's membership 11 were called to a final story and ultimately to God's glory.


Finances - Blessings and Struggles

In the last 15 years the budget of Zion has almost doubled. This year's donations are above last year's. This is something fantastic to celebrate. Not for purposes of finances or for purposes of merit, those things belong to the glory of God and the increased ability to share and to tell His story. However, in the physical realm, we have been doing many updates to the facility. New carpet, new paint, new furnace, thermostat wiring, updates to older plumbing, a new electronic presence, and landscaping of the facility -- has meant that Zion looks better than before and is being well maintained. However, at a cost. I'll direct your attention to the financial reports. Your generosity has been fantastic, and yet this year has had financial need.

Deaths ... 2023 ... and a hope that does not disappoint!

I write this from the beginning of 2023. In the New Year, so far, we have had at Zion four funerals in quick succession. We have been touched by two other funerals in the same timeframe. By many standards, funerals are failure, the end of a story, and symbolic of the corrosive experience of this life. Conversely, in faith, in Jesus, at Zion we are also reminded amid our grief of the experience of being called HOME. real home. A permanent home. A home that endures. Ultimately this experience of death, and the fruition of faith is why Zion exists. are here to tell a story of Jesus that supports one in life, and in death ushers in eternal...I struggle for the word. The promise in Jesus Something we have not experienced, but in 2022 11 is that great. members have led the way toward all the grace, good, and promises we here apprehend by faith. They, those departed, see them by sight. For those who have gone before us, for the story of faith before us, and for the road ahead in faith ... God bless the ministry of Zion Lutheran Church, Humboldt Iowa, and the faithful people here!

WORSHIP SCHEDULE AT ZION LUTHERAN CHURCH

Zion congregation was organized in 1884 in Beaver Township, Humboldt. Our congregation joined the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod in 1930. The present sanctuary was dedicated in August of 1971. The addition of the new fellowship hall and classroom space was dedicated on November 11, 2001.

The governing body of the congregation is the Congregational Meeting with most of the regular decisions delegated to the Church Council which meets monthly. The Annual Congregational Meeting is held in January, unless otherwise needed. The quorum for a Congregational Meeting is 20 members present. All communicant members of Zion 18 years of age and older are voting members. The election of officers will take place before and after services on the second Sunday and previous Saturday in December.

Holy Communion is celebrated on the first and third Sunday of each month with distribution of both common cup and individual glass. Holy Communion is celebrated on the Saturdays preceding the first and third Sunday of each month with distribution by the individual glass. Ash Wednesday and Midweek Lent and Advent services are held on Wednesday evenings beginning at 6:45 p.m.

Subscription to The Lutheran Witness, the official publication of the LC-MS, is made available to all who indicate they would like to receive this publication. Members are encouraged to pay the subscription rate to help defray the cost to the congregation, this is not necessary to receive it. The current cost of a subscription is \$26.16. If you are moving and have received the Lutheran Witness, please notify the church office of your change of address so that your subscription address can also be changed.



USHERS

Lance Olson has been appointed Head Usher for 2023. Andy Manteufel is the assigned elder liaison. A reminder e-mail will be sent to you just prior to your appointed usher schedule and a description of the duties will be sent to the head ushers. IF YOU ARE UNABLE TO USHER DURING YOUR SCHEDULED TIME, FIND SOMEONE TO REPLACE OR SWITCH SCHEDULES. LET THE HEAD USHER OF YOUR MONTH KNOW ABOUT THIS CHANGE IN SCHEDULE.

Again, this year the ushers are responsible for transporting and taking care of the Care Center worshipers. There may be times when the ushers need extra help and ask for your assistance. Your support will be greatly appreciated.

WHEN YOU ARE ILL

- 1. Notify the pastor before you leave for the hospital and just as soon as you return home.
- 2. If you are ill at home and wish the pastor to call, notify him.
- 3. Whenever prayers of intercession or thanksgiving are desired, please request them, as at the birth of a child or in case of an illness or recovery.
- 4. Give names of new people moving into the area to the pastor or a member of the Evangelism Board.

COMMUNION

- 1. If anyone has relatives or friends visiting and they would like to partake of communion, please speak with the pastor before the service. (Please remember that we, as a member of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, practice "closed" communion.)
- Please fill out a communion card before communing as this is our way of keeping records at church. They are on the table in the Narthex.
 - If you forget to fill out a card before the service, please do so following worship.

MOVING

- 1. When moving away, please inform the pastor. He can help you find a Lutheran Church in your area so that you can attend its services.
- 2. When you have moved, write or call the pastor for a transfer to the newly found church.
- 3. Ask the pastor for a guest communion card if you plan to be gone less than a year.
- 4. Please leave a change of address in the church office as there is a small fee for address corrections.



PRAYER CHAIN



Following is a list of some of the Bible Studies held in 2022:





Early in November we all brought items for the Wilson Benefit Silent Auction and supper.


