"... Yet who knows whether you have come to the kingdom for such a time as this."

Esther 4:14

That was easy for UNCLE MORDECAI to say! HE wasn't the one who would risk their life approaching the king. ESTHER was. Remember that in their world, it was risky to approach the king on his throne if he didn't invite you. If you entered the back of the throne room and he did NOT hold out his scepter

towards you, his guards would take you out and kill you.

But if Queen Esther did NOT talk to the king, the new law would soon go into effect and non-Jews in the vast kingdom could kill Jews at will. Esther was in a position to influence the king to help the Jews (the king had approved the new law after being deceived by his top advisor Haman.) But the king had not called for Esther for a whole month. Imagine the possibilities: Had he lost interest in her? Was she not important enough for him to talk to about matters of the kingdom? Did he think she was just a pretty face who didn't know much about anything anyway? These and other possibilities made it quite dangerous to approach the king.

So Esther had delayed using her influence – the position to which God brought her. (Esther chapter 1 shows another example of how God is clearly at work in our world). So Mordecai encouraged her with those words: "Who knows? God very likely put you in this position at this time for His important purpose of rescuing His people." And yet Mordecai knew God didn't need ANY human's help. He told her that if she did NOT approach the king for help, God would deliver His people some other way.

After asking all the Jews to fast and pray for 3 days, Esther DID approach the king, and he made a new law to arm the Jews so they could defend themselves. And they did so valiantly that today Jews STILL celebrate that great deliverance.


The book of Esther has MANY great lessons about God and how He deals with us — delivers us. For example, it is NEVER risky to approach THE king on HIS throne. The book of Esther has yet one more case where God destroys those who want to destroy US. In this case Haman wanted to destroy the Jews, and he hung on the very gallows he built to hang Jewish leaders. When Jesus returns, He will finally totally destroy OUR destroyers: death and the devil. And already, He has freed us from bondage to them.

If I can make the time for it, I hope to develop a 3-4 week sermon series of encouragement based on the main sections of Esther, coupled with a Gospel text which dovetails with the lessons in Esther. Whether I accomplish that or not, I pray that you will remember, especially when life is hard, that God put you HERE "for such a time as this." Let's each take that truth to heart, and enjoy being "in the game" (in the BATTLE) for which He brought you here – now.

There's too much at stake to sit on our hands.

ZION LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES February 12, 2024 - 8:00 p.m.

The February 12, 2024, meeting of the Zion Lutheran Church Council was called to order at 7:59 p.m. by President Kent Stern. There were 13 members present. Pastor Aaron led the opening prayer. The minutes of the December 11, 2023, meeting were approved as printed.

Reports:

Stewardship: Gary Peyton reported that everything is going well with the counters.

Education: Dee Stern reported that Amber Townsend is serving as secretary. The Education Board will be serving the March 6th Lenten Supper. April 28th will be the next Intergenerational Sunday School Sunday.

Evangelism: Pastor Aaron reported that the Evangelism Board will be serving the March 20th Lenten Supper.

LWML: Amy Frehse reported that the first evening LWML meeting was attended by 11 women. There were 2 new ladies who attended. The February ingathering list of items needed is in both the bulletin and newsletter. The LWML will be serving the February 21st Lenten Supper.

DCE/Youth Board: DCE Thomas Wilson presented his printed report. This report is filed with these minutes.

MSC Treasurer: Treasurer Tim McCartan gave an oral report. Marian Anderson made a motion to accept the oral report. Dee Stern seconded the motion. Motion carried.

MSC Financial Secretary: Financial Secretary Marian Anderson presented the printed report. Tim McCartan made a motion to accept the Financial Secretary's report as printed. Joe Olson seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Trustees: Adam Parle reported that they have installed new lights where they were needed.

Moving Forward by Faith

One of the features of the "Effective Stewardship" program is an annual stewardship campaign. Most churches hold this in the fall, although some have it in the winter/spring. (We use the term "Fall Campaign" to refer to both.)

The Fall Campaign is not an integral part of the "Effective Stewardship" program, but we provide it to those churches that desire it. The Fall Campaign simply takes the place of one month in the regular "Effective Stewardship" program.

We would be delighted to provide a Fall Campaign for your church. This fresh, new approach could be just what your church needs to get out of the doldrums that come from trying to recycle what you've used in the past.

The theme of this year's campaign is "Moving Forward by Faith." Based on Hebrews 11:6, the Campaign considers what faith is, how we develop faith, what it means to trust God, putting God to the test by stepping out by faith, etc.

The Campaign concludes after four weeks by seeking a commitment for financial support in the coming year. Special emphasis is placed on first-fruits giving and on trusting God to provide, even when the source of the funds might not be known.

One of the Lay Speaker presentations features this quote:

Make no mistake about it: God owns everything. We are just managers and stewards of what God has entrusted to us. Our attitude should be what one author described as "vagrant faith," that is, a spirit of having everything in Christ but of owning nothing. Owners, you see, have rights; managers and stewards have responsibilities. As managers and stewards, we are responsible to manage what God has entrusted to us.

Another Lay Speaker presentation, describing faithful people in Scripture, states:

Their names are forever recorded in the annals of the faithful — not because they were always faithful (they weren't) or because they were super-human (they weren't) or even because they were super spiritual (they weren't), but because they obeyed God. Their basic heart attitude was to do what God told them to do.

"I have held many things in my hands, and I have lost them all. But whatever I have placed in God's hands, that I still possess." (Martin Luther)

"Jesus Christ said more about money than about any other single thing because, when it comes to a man's real nature, money is of first importance. Money is an exact index to a man's true character. All through Scripture there is an intimate correlation between the development of a man's character and how he handles his money." (Richard Halverson)

"You reap what you sow, more than you sow, and later than you sow." (Charles Stanley)

We are personally accountable to God for how we use the money He has entrusted to us.

"For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive what is due for what he has done in the body, whether good or evil" (2 Cor. 5:10).

Applying Bible Principles

If you read annual reports from publicly held companies or banks, you will frequently see the word "fiduciary." Fiduciary is used as an adjective to describe something which is held in trust. It is also used as a noun to describe the one who is a trustee who must account for that which is held in trust.

For example, a bank president has a fiduciary responsibility to stockholders in the bank and to depositors who place their money in the bank. A company treasurer has a fiduciary responsibility to the owners of the company. A payroll clerk has a fiduciary responsibility to pay people what they have earned.

You may never have considered yourself a fiduciary, and you may never have acted officially in a fiduciary capacity, but in reality, you are a fiduciary. All of us are. That applies both to Christians and to those who are not part of God's family through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. We who are Christians will stand before the Judgment Seat of Christ. There, we will not be judged for salvation, since the penalty and judgment for sin was settled once and for all on the cross of Calvary when the Lord Jesus paid the price for our sin. Instead, when we stand before Christ, we will give an account of how we have used what God has entrusted to us.

Just as a bank president must account to stockholders and depositors on how their funds are used, we must account to Christ for how we have used what God has entrusted to us. Since everything we have rightfully belongs to Him, we will need to report on how we have managed His assets!

As you consider how you have used what God has entrusted to your care and keeping during the past few months, what kind of job have you done? And more importantly, as a "fiduciary" of what God has placed in your hands, will you stand before Him with joy, eager to report on your giving and management of His assets?
