## **COVID Reopening and the Fall**

Blessings in Christ!

I'm not sure if it's your lived experience, but in the church there were strange meetings for closing things down in the church when Covid hit. We'd have a meeting, talk through an issue, and make a call. Issues such as masks, hand sanitizer, closing church, video services, and a whole bunch of other things were discussed. Sometimes the decisions were seamless and smooth and sometimes they aroused a bit of debate. But, as a community, we seem to be coming out of this long Covid tunnel.

And now the reverse is happening. We are debating and holding meetings about how to re-open.

### **Communion**

Very likely, but not as of this writing certain, we will be returning to our standard communion practice around the altar itself. For the period of Covid we have been using gloves, hand sanitizer, a mobile communion platform, masks, individual water cups, and a host of other precautions.

We have been asking the congregation, and the response back that we heard seems favorable to doing communion together around the altar once again. We will still take a few precautions for the communion service. Look for this change in July.

### **Wednesday Services?**

We have been debating doing a Wednesday service for a long time. This service would likely be a shorter service that goes with the themes for the upcoming weekend. The service format would be similar to the Advent and Lenten services that we typically hold. The time frame would also be similar, in that 30-45 minute range.

The idea for this has come about as many, especially younger families, seem to have a busy schedule of events on the weekend. The Wednesday evening timeframe in Humboldt seems to be better protected from other events than, sadly, even Sunday. We are hoping that this opens newer avenues for people to attend worship.

## **Bible Studies**

During the Covid lockdown in person Bible studies became much more difficult. It showed up in Zoom Bible studies, in people not attending a Bible study, and in smaller size groups for the Bible studies we had.

We would like to encourage you back this fall and will be advertising the Bible studies we offer. There is something so good about being in God's word.

Toward that endeavor, we have also long been talking about a Bible study that happens at local restaurants that have, Lutheran beverages. Look for advertising for this study this fall.

## **In Person — It's a good thing**

If our isolation has an upshot, it's that perhaps it's rekindled our passion for meeting in person. God has most certainly created us to be people in relationships with others and in His Church and the in-person format is the best way to accomplish this fellowship. Electronics and devices, for all their current glamor, fall so short.

We also have discussed a problem. How do we encourage people back?

We have been live-streaming the services for over a year now and there might be a certain appeal to attending church at home, maybe in pajamas eating ice-cream. And while I like ice cream and pajamas maybe more than the next person, and maybe coffee too, we also want to re-affirm that there is something good about the gathering of people in person.

Look for encouragement from Zion in the future to invite you back. There is something good about being together as His people and hearing His word.

## ZION'S ADULT CHOIR

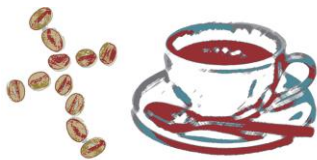

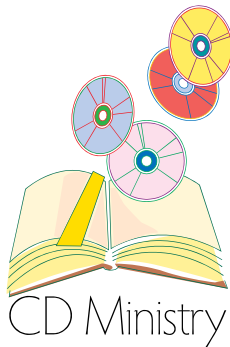
## **FLOWER & LUTHERAN HOUR CHARTS**

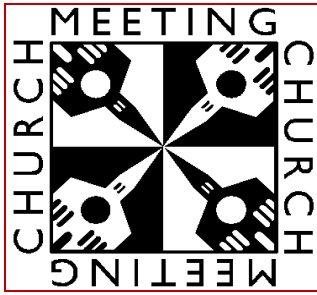

**New Business:** no new business.

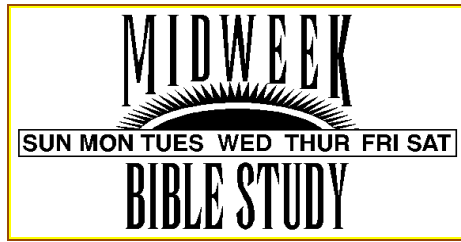
Being no further business, the Council Meeting was adjourned at 8:50 p.m. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
